His work utilizes instrumental performance, theater, new media, and installation in concert, site-specific, and digital contexts. He is an improviser who performs on piano, organ, and guitar, and occasionally other instruments. His compositional work engages with artistic labor and production, communization, film and media theory, intermedia, and materialist aesthetics. His current practice aims to use the concert site as the nexus of social reorganization through workshop and documentary formats. Langdon works as a piano and composition teacher, as well as an arts administrator and organizer. He fights for equality and inclusivity in the various institutions he works in. He writes on music, art, politics, and culture.
